#### Impact Analysis PPG 2015/16

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG), which is additional to the main school funding, is seen by the government as the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and their peers, by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. At Suffield Park Infant and Nursery School we support all our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching supplemented by targeted interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required.

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for the pupils who belong to vulnerable groups. This includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged are adequately assessed and addressed
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that receiving a
  free school meal does not always mean a pupil is socially disadvantaged
- We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil and groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged
- The Pupil Premium funding is allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups and individuals.

Impact analysis.

The pupil premium will be targeted using the following categories

- Learning and curriculum
- Social, emotional and behavioural needs
- Enrichment beyond the curriculum
- Families and communities
