SCHOOL CLOSURE (DUE TO BAD WEATHER OR OTHER EMERGENCIES)

REMINDERS

• If a child has sickness or diarrhoea they should remain off school for **48 HOURS** (if your child is over 5) **or 72 HOURS** (if your child is under 5) **AFTER** it has stopped.
