

## What support can we offer?



- A visit to your school to discuss the needs of the child, teacher, teaching assistant, year group or school as a whole.
- Modelled interaction/strategies and approaches, through working with the child with SLCN within a small group and suggest or provide resources for follow up activities.
- Guidance on effective resources/use of space to ensure a 'communication friendly' learning environment.
- Guidance and training for individuals or groups of staff on strategies to support children with SLCN.
- Signposting to alternative provision if our SLCN outreach service is not appropriate.
- Whole school/ cluster CPD on SLCN issues, through training sessions such as;

SLCN: An Overview of Difficulties & Strategies  
SLCN: Strategies and Activities to Support Children

SLCN: Establishing Effective Language Groups.

SLCN: Vocabulary and Word Finding Skills.

SLCN: Phonological Awareness Activities to support the Development of Early Literacy Skills.



There will be a flat fee of £50 to contribute towards travel and resource expenses for the initial and any subsequent visits. Additional charges will be incurred if whole school/cluster CPD on SLCN issues is requested.

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## Introduction to SLCN outreach provision.



We are a group of experienced and highly qualified SLCN Specialist Resource Base teachers, who as well as teaching classes within our specialist settings, offer support to teachers to enable them to fully support children with SLCN within mainstream classes. We work closely with Speech Therapists, so are able to seek advice regarding children's specific difficulties, but we are not qualified to address speech sound difficulties ourselves or deliver speech therapy.

## Our Aims

Our aim is to secure better outcomes for children with SLCN across Norfolk, by helping to promote the participation and achievement of such children. We will do this by supporting staff in mainstream schools to better understand the needs of children with SLCN and to help develop strategies to support the children more effectively, enabling them to reach their potential within their mainstream setting.



## Desirable outcomes for schools and children.



- Staff in schools will feel better equipped and more able to meet the needs of children with SLCN.
- Schools will feel more confident, enabling children with SLCN to be included and achieve well within their mainstream class.
