
Dictated Sentences

What is a dictated sentence?

A dictated sentence is a sentence that you tell your child. Your child has to remember the sentence and write it down using the correct punctuation. All the dictated sentences in this document contain Year One Common Exception Words for your child to practise.

How to use dictated sentences:

Choose a sentence to use. Say the sentence a number of times with your child before they write it down (you could use different voices each time you say the sentence e.g. a whisper, a shout, a robot voice, like a mouse etc.) Once your child has remembered the sentence, ask them to write it down. Once they have written the sentence use this self check stick to check their work with them.



We recommend choosing two sentences to do a day with your child. Here are some you can use:

- The dog is on the rug.
- I can see the rain.
- I go the park.
- A green frog is on a log.
- Has your fish got red fins?
