
Phonics Activities.

How many real words can you make?




Can you spot the ie, igh and y words in this story?

Extension: Can you write the words in a sentence using a capital letter and full stop?


Write a word using each phoneme:


Extension: Can you think of some more words that use o-e or oe?

These words use a-e: Say the names of the pictures out loud Listen to the phonemes. Now write the words.


Extension: Can you write a sentence about one of the pictures?
